Aibreán 16, 1978, 10 a.m. bhí na réaltmairnealaigh gleasta in a spás cultha agus iad ceangouilte go daingean i suideachain na spás luinige. Bhí greadam feargach le cloisint ón inneall. I seomra an tiomanuidhe bhi an Doctúir O Cearnaigh ag eisteacht leis an gcreolusán.

10:05 a.m. thosnuigh an comhaireamh deireannach, deich, naoi, ocht,.... dó, aon, zéro. D'oscail an tiomanuidhe an luasan. Cluin-eadh gleo timpisteach, tubaisteach, uathbhásach. D'eirigh an spás long go h-obann. Bhí an inneall ag luíraigh go nearbhamhail. De réir dealramh bhí Gleann an Phortaigh ag eirigh míos lughá. Tareis tre-mhse gearr ní raibh an baile beag le feicsint i n-aonchur. Anois bhí cruth comhruinn an domhain i bhfiadhnaise. 10:30 a.m. d'eirigh mala a bhí caithe ar an urlar go taibhseamhail agus le ciuneas. Baineadh geit as na réaltmairnealaigh ach ní raibh faic ann. Bhí an spás long ag fagáil slán le plána codthromacht an domhain. Amuigh bhí an cruinn ag dul i laighead do réir a cheile.

Aibreán 19, 7:00 a.m. dhiúsigh an tiomanuidhe an Doctúir O Cearnaigh. "Taimid ag teacht i ngioracht do plána codthromacht na gealaigheanois agus ní mór díum diaithir a thabhairt timcheall an airdrinn ar-dhis. Ta se ró-contabhairteach dul isteach an treo is giorra". Annsin cuireadh tus leis an turus seacrá-nach go oromchla na gealaighe. De réir dealramh cuadar timcheall an airdrinn mile uaire. Níorbh fhada

go raibh na sleibhte agus na lochanna soileir. Chonnair an tiomanuidhe macaise mor agus shil se gur fearr dhó an spás long a thabairt isteach annsin. Dhún sé an luasan diaidh ar ndiadh. D'eirigh an dromchla le casadh ar an spásghiaistean, ceapfir. Annsinbhuailendar a cheile go feargach. Stadadh na h-innill agus bhi ciúineas ann.
